Earned Value is not a software product or tool. It is a collection of management practices that are used to establish and maintain a performance measurement baseline from which to measure and analyze performance, identify variances to the baseline, and forecast the project outcome. Earned Value effectively integrates the work scope of a project or program with the schedule and cost elements for optimum program planning and control to support project management decisions-making.
